

Situation in the Middle East: Immigration Considerations and Solutions for Business Continuity

Background

As the events in the Middle East continue to evolve, an increasing concern for businesses navigating the uncertainty is the safety of employees and ongoing business continuity. For some, this may result in relocation of staff on a short or long-term basis or discontinuation of travel.

This guide is intended to help companies identify some key steps they can take to better understand the impact and manage the risk.

What actions should be taken?

- ▶ Identify all impacted employees including local and foreign nationals.
- ▶ Identify the valid visas held by all impacted employees to facilitate speedy, temporary relocation if required - e.g., Schengen Visas, US B-1, UK Visitor Visa, etc.
- ▶ Advise all impacted foreign national employees to register their presence with their home country embassy.
- ▶ Advise all employees to collect all original biographical documentation e.g., passports, birth/marriage certificates and have them readily available.

How can the Fragomen team help?
